He was a member of the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution and was President of the Iowa Society of the Sons of the American Revolution. As part of those memberships, Bill represented Iowa as the Iowa Trustee to the National Headquarters of the SAR for 35 years through 2016. In 1992 he was named a Minuteman for his service to the National Society of the SAR, the highest award for a member.

Compatriot David Lamb's Notes Prince William and Prince Harry's Military Service

Lads,

A bit of British military history to celebrate the Royal wedding. If you watched the wedding, you noticed that Harry and William were both in uniforms. William was originally commissioned into the "Blues and Royals" and is the honorary Col.-in-Chief of the Welsh Guards (he also holds commissions in the Irish Guards, the Coldstream Guards, the RAF, the Royal Navy, and a couple of other units that I

don't recall off the top).

Harry served in both the Royal Marines for a bit, but then actually served two tours in Afghanistan with the Blues and Royals an armored cavalry unit in the modern army, and the guys that you see on horseback ahead of, and behind the carriage (called the Ascot Landau) that Harry and Meghan took a spin through Windsor and the Great Park following today's wedding. He holds the rank of Major.

Both men graduated from "Sandhurst", the British equivalent of the USMA at West Point. Both are fully qualified military pilots.

Under British law, William (who is actually second in line for the throne) is not allowed to serve in a combat unit of the military. Hence, he could not remain as an active line officer in a combat unit like the Blues and Royals. So....actually found his niche by becoming a very talented sea rescue helicopter pilot for the Royal Air Force Sea Rescue. He did manage to fly two fixed wing re-supply missions into Afghanistan. He also holds a commission in the Royal Navy.

Harry, on the other hand, served in forward deployed units on both tours in Afghanistan, and is VERY highly thought of as "one of the lads" by the men of both units--hence their presence on the steps of St. George's Chapel to render their sabre salutes as the newlyweds left the church; and, their ceremonial mounted escorts in today's ceremonies. During one of his deployments in the ATO, his unit came to the rescue of a Gurkha unit...thus earning their undying gratitude (they were also there today, outside the chapel to lend moral support and honor their "mate."

The "Blues and Royals" date from the period of Oliver Cromwell's "New Model Army" of the mid 1500's and are distinguished by their red (The Royals) and blue (The Blues) tunics. They have been amalgamated now, and both are headquartered at Horse Guards Palace at the opposite end of St. James's Park from Buckingham Palace.
