Wreaths Across America at Woodland Cemetery in Des Moines, IA

IASSAR Color Guard Commander Mike Rowley led the Wreaths Across America event at Woodland Cemetery in Des Moines, IA on December 18, 2021. After welcoming those in attendance and acknowledging the beautiful sounds of bag piper Dawn Baldwin, he introduced Ganesh Ganpat, Des Moines Parks and Recreation supervisor, to give instructions about placing wreaths. After a moment of silence, Rowley explained that there were over 1,000 wreaths to be placed this year. A goal for future events is to have a wreath for all 1,283 veterans buried in the cemetery. After thanking individuals, businesses, and organizations that had made donations, the Colors were posted, led by Sirmichael Carrington Williams-Thomas of Boy Scout Troop 178.

Special wreaths were laid for each branch of service. Special Forces Retired Sergeant Major Donald L. Pugsley laid a wreath in memory of those who served and are serving in the United States Army. Kristine Firestine, the mother of naval recruit Christian, laid a wreath in memory of those who served and are serving



in the United State Navy. Marine veteran Jeremy Dirksen, who joined the United States Marines Corps in 1996 as an Aviation Support Specialist, laid a wreath in memory of those who served and are serving in the United States Marines. Air Force veteran Ron Rittle laid a wreath in memory of those who served and are serving in the United States Air Force. Ron Ward, Parks Manager, laid a wreath in memory of those who served and are serving in the United States Space Force. Army veteran and retired Des Moines firefighter Bob Niffenegger laid a wreath in memory of those who served and are serving in the United States Coast Guard. Army and Iowa National Guard veteran Scott Rowley laid a wreath in memory of those who served and are serving in the United States Merchant Marines. Marilyn Rittel, whose father was a POW in WWII, laid a wreath in honor of the 93.129 United States servicemen and servicewomen from all branches of the service whose last status was either POW or MIA.

Volunteers laid over 1,000 wreaths, saying the name of the veteran aloud as each wreath was laid. The ceremony was concluded with the sounding of Taps by Sgt. David Krcil of the 34th Army Band. Iowa SAR members Rick Hickman, Jerry Greenfield, Ron Rittle, Bob Niffenegger, David Rowley, Scott Rowley, and Mike Rowley were in attendance for the event.

After the speech, volunteers laid wreaths on the graves of veterans while saying their names. Volunteers placed 3,943 wreaths, enough for every headstone in the cemetery.
