

A good time was had by those who attended the Great Plains Regional meeting. Please make plans now to attend next summer's regional meeting in Overland Park, Kansas.





Patriotic sayings and essays were presented. The ashes were properly buried following the ceremony. Rick Vector, Newton, a costumed American Revolutionary War interpreter, answered several questions about his uniform, about the War and the life style of the colonial soldier and his family. He showed how to load his musket and demonstrated its use. The flag retirement ceremony is a semi-annual event. The next scheduled ceremony will be July 2009.




If you're coming from Interstate 80:

- Go North on Jordan Creek Parkway to Westown Parkway
- · Turn Right (East) on Westown Parkway
- Follow the street until you see the building with green awning on the right, front signage reads "The Plaza"
- · Turn in the first entrance
- · We're in Suite 220 on the West end of building

If you're coming from University:

- · Go South on Jordan Creek Parkway to Westown Parkway
- · Turn Left (East) on Westown Parkway
- Follow the street until you see the building with green awning on the right, front signage reads "The Plaza"
- Turn in the <u>first</u> entrance
- · We're in Suite 220 on the West end of building

I.S.S.C.A.R. State Project



This year's State Project asks all lowa C.A.R. members to assemble CARE packages for Veterans of the U.S. armed services. Each society is asked to collect items and deliver them to veteran's hospitals throughout

lowa. Our veterans deserve our gratitude and respect. We can let them know just how much we care with Project CARE. This project is inspired by recent news of the neglect experienced by veterans at facilities at Walter Reed Army Medical Center just 5 miles from the White House in Washington, D.C.

To organize your society's PROJECT CARE, follow this timeline:

SUMMER/FALL 2007

- --Collect large shoe boxes
- -- Collect donations & shop for items

WINTER 2007/2008--Each C.A.R. chapter delivers all their CARE shoe boxes to the Veterans facility nearest to them; take a photo and submit it to your local newspaper.

What to include in each CARE shoe box

T-shirts, underwear, socks

Toothbrush, toothpaste, dental floss

Shampoo

Soap or body wash and washcloth

Deodorant

Razors, shaving cream

Nail clippers

Breath mints, gum, candy

Lip balm

Small notebook and pen, deck of cards
