Medal and Certificate Awarded to Mary O'Connell for Saving a Life

On March 20th, Randy Lyon and I met with Mary O'Connell at her house. Her grandsons and her daughter were there to see Mary receive a medal and certificate for saving the life of a shopper at a Fareway grocery store in Dubuque, Iowa.

Mary is a retired nurse who is finishing her working career as a checkout operator at Fareway. A female shopper had a cardiac arrest incident, and Mary revived the shopper by performing CPR until the EMS arrived. They took the shopper to the UnityPoint Finley Hospital in Dubuque. She was then transferred to St. Luke's Hospital in Cedar Rapids where she had surgery on her heart. She returned to Dubuque to enjoy Thanksgiving, Christmas, and a wedding anniversary.

On Sunday, April 16th, a full military burial was held at Fort Atkinson, Nebraska, for Lt. Gabriel Field.

Lt. Field served in the Kentucky Volunteers and Kentucky Militia during the War of 1812. He later served at Fort Atkinson from 1818 to 1823. A portion of his original headstone was found by John "Jack" Rathjen in 1954 while plowing a field, and since then his remains have been exhumed and finally reintered at Fort Atkinson on the 200th anniversary of his death.

Iowa SAR Supports Local Decorated World War I Veteran

Michael Spautz approached me recently about helping him on an important project. Michael is the grandson of Matthew Spautz, a hero of World War I and the recipient of the Distinguished Service Cross. He wondered if I would help him get his grandfather's name on a soon-to-be-renamed local park.

Sergeant Spautz served with Company A, 168th Infantry Regiment, 42nd Division (the Rainbow Division) of the American Expeditionary Forces near the Ourcq River, northeast of Chateau-Thierry, France. When the commander of the unit became ill, Spautz was assigned to lead the advance of July 30th, 1918. While in command of his platoon, Sergeant Spautz was wounded twice, but continued until hit a third time. He then refused to leave the field until the last wounded man of his platoon had been sent to the aid station. He died en route to the hospital. He was 19 years old.

Using the information given to me by Michael, I wrote the application and submitted it to the Park and Recreation Commission. On March 10th, Michael and I were notified that our application, one of 103 names submitted, had been accepted as a semi-finalist.

I wrote an email to the chairperson expressing our honor at being a semi-finalist. Speaking on behalf of the SAR, I expressed my appreciation that the Commission had among its semi-finalists two Distinguished Service Cross veterans as well as the name of a World Ward II veteran. I expressed our appreciation as an organization dedicated to our veterans and to those who remember their service.

As of this writing, the Park and Recreation Commission has taken the issue under advisement.

Stark Report: Congratulations, Iowa!

The Iowa SAR has been chosen to receive the USS Stark Memorial Award for most active chapter with over 200 members, another USS Stark Memorial Award for most active state society with less than 1,000 members, and a State Veterans Service Award. These awards will be presented at the 2023 Congress to be held this summer in Orlando, Florida.

The Stark Report is an evaluative tool from the National Society to show us how well we are working in support of our veterans. This was the first year the Iowa Society submitted a report. The actual report was eight pages long and included service to a VA Hospital Council, service in a VA Hospital, visits to a veteran in a hospital, donated gifts to veterans in a hospital, financial donations to any organization whose primary clients were veterans, publications donated to organizations dealing primarily with veterans, participation in the SAR Wounded Warriors program, activities with other organizations supporting veterans, decorating veteran's graves and attendance at funerals, and donations of clothing or working items to veterans' organizations. In addition to the eight page report, we offered seven typed pages of supporting and supplemental detail.

Thanks to everyone in the Iowa SAR for your contributions in bringing this honor home! We're looking forward to 2023 in fulfilling our goals of being a blessing to our veterans.
