
Liberty Tree Signage Completed in Dubuque

U.S. Army 250th

This stamp celebrates the 250th anniversary of the U.S. Army. Established by the Continental Congress in 1775, the Army is now a global force with a clear purpose: to fight and win America's wars. Featuring the military service mark of the U.S. Army against a white background,

the stamp was designed by Antonio Alcalá, an art director of the UPS



. U.S. Marine Corps 250th

The familiar symbolism of a Marine Corps emblem appears on this stamp to celebrate the 250th anniversary of the U.S. Marine Corps. First established during the Revolutionary War as the American colonies fought for independence, the Marine Corps is respected worldwide as an elite fighting force, prepared to face any challenge and prevail in the

conflicts of the 21st century. Antonio Alcalá, an art director for USPS, designed the stamp.



U.S. Navy 250th

Established during the Revolutionary War as the American colonies fought for independence, the U.S. Navy is now at the forefront of cutting-edge technology that safeguards the maritime interests of the United States, ensuring economic

prosperity and the freedom of the seas. Featuring the emblem of the Navy against a white background, this stamp celebrates the U.S. Navy's 250th anniversary. Antonio Alcalá, an art director for USPS, designed the stamp.

For over 100 years at least 15 Union Civil War veterans of the have laid in unmarked graves in the Grand Army of the Republic section of Glendale Cemetery.

With the assistance of the Des Moines Cemetery staff, the research of retired Des Moines firefighter Bob Niffenegger and the documentation work of several groups including the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, the Sons of the American Revolution, the General Society of the War of 1812, the Daughters of the American Revolution, the Colonial Dames, MOLLUS, and others these soldiers and their families will be remembered by the placement of 240 lbs granite stones from the VA.

At the time of enlistment these soldiers ranged in age from 17 to 35. They were from NY, MN, PA, OH, IN, MO, IL, AL, and Iowa. At the time of their death they ranged from 27 to 86 years of age. All chose Iowa as their final home.

We may never know why they were unmarked for over 100 years but, now that will be corrected.
