Mason has been the driving force for years behind two local initiatives celebrating veterans and showcasing America's patriotism and freedoms — Dubuque's annual Fireworks & Airshow Spectacular and Honor Flight of Dubuque and the Tri-States.

As a member of the IA SAR, 1812, SUVCW and other organizations I feel like I sometimes have a front row seat to see the best people have to offer in terms of service and commitment.

We all know of the parades, ceremonies, historical programs, speaker programs and special events. We see the volunteerism shared in terms of the different talents and resources our members bring when needed.

For one of our members, there is even more in terms of his outreach, but it largely goes unseen, except for those who need it most.

Randy Breese has not only stepped up to take on several officer roles in IA 1812, Sons of the American Revolution, and Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, he also has been busy elsewhere.

Those of us SUVCW members knew that we were no longer seeing Randy at the meetings but not everyone realized that was because he was part of a group that prepares and distributes meals on those nights to many of the homeless in Des Moines.

On those Thursday nights, they often serve over 450 across 8 routes this time of year.

Seeing a need for even more, Randy and a smaller group are also making up and distributing about 60 bags of shelf stable food for Saturday deliveries. It takes some digging to get Randy to share more but this is what I was able to learn from Randy about his recent works...

"I've been doing a weekend delivery on my own for about 6 months because of reduced availability of food on the weekends for our friends on the street.

I am told this came up in a board meeting when they were discussing expansion options.

I like to think I made a little impact. How much influence, I don't know. I participate in the Saturday route, but I still make about a dozen bags of food (PB&J sandwich, turkey and cheese sandwich, fruit, water, chips, cookie) and lately I've been making a large batch of a hot casserole which I serve in 16oz coffee cups.

This weekend was tater tot casserole, which was very popular. And we had lots of blankets and some coats to hand out, along with hand warmers, foot warmers, etc. Thanks for sharing this story! We're always happy to have folks join us, even if it's just for one night."

Thanks, Randy. Your ancestors would be proud. Your fellow compatriots of IA SAR salute you!

Randy Lyon in Dubuque has entered his intention in both sources to offer on July 2 and 3 a program on the Riverwalk in Dubuque promoting the SAR plaque honoring Jean Marie Cardinal, “Iowa’s Paul Revere” of the American Revolution.

Given the warning, the residents were able to defeat the British in a battle which guaranteed the Mississippi River would not be in British hands when a peace treaty was eventually signed.
